SALESIAN REFLECTION

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time (9/22/2024)

At Jesus' baptism by John in the Jordan, the Father had identified Jesus as his Son, the beloved one in whom he is well pleased. This is a reference to the "suffering servant" in the prophet Isaiah. The servant must suffer and die to fully actualize his identity.

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins to prepare his disciples for what is to come. He identifies himself with the "just one' in the Book of Wisdom which we heard in today's first reading. He will be put to the test to give proof of his gentleness and patience. He will be condemned to a shameful death – and God will take care of him.

Mark comments that the disciples did not understand the saying and were afraid to question him. Apparently, they distracted themselves by arguing about who was the greatest among them.

Jesus was not distracted and continued to teach them about himself and how they were to live. "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Jesus is among them as servant - the "suffering servant."

The child Jesus places in their midst and embraces is how they are to receive him: peaceably, gently, without inconstancy or insincerity, open to wisdom from above.

Jesus comes to us as the "suffering servant" – Savior and Lord. He invites us to embrace him as he did the child. May we not allow ourselves to become distracted by petty, personal concerns. Let us accept Jesus as the First and Only in our lives, for he has shown us how to be the last and the servant of all.

Welcome! PREP will begin on Sun., Sept. 29, 2024. All children who attend PREP must be registered in the program before attending on Sept. 29.



To the Congregants of Our Lady Star of the Sea:

I would like to thank you all for your very generous food donations. You have all been champions of the Food Closet for many years, and without your active support we would not be as effective supporting our neighbors.

In 2023 the Food Closet served 5,173 adults and 1,771 children in 3,299 families. This represents 73.4% increase from 2022, and a 93% increase from 2021. This client growth, along with inflation, has had a significant impact on our operational costs which more than doubled this year. We are on track to exceed these numbers in 2024.

We are proud to meet this challenge and to honor our 42-year history of continuous operations. The clients we serve are truly our neighbors - the single mom with three kids working two jobs; the injured construction worker who hasn't been able to work for the last four months; the widow living in Victorian Towers on a fixed income; the retired veteran and his wife who can't make ends meet with Social Security.

Your generous donations go directly into tangible assistance for our neighbors. Thank you again for your ongoing support.



Cremation and Proper Handling of Cremated Remains Your Choices Don't Stop with Cremation

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead.


September 2024 Update
